



APPLY SOME SMART STORAGE SOLUTIONS

- ◆ Breathe new life into your Jo Malone Wild Bluebell Home Candle, £40, after it's burned out. Put the votive (1) into the freezer overnight then scoop out the hardened wax with a knife and you have a beautiful container that lends itself to a multitude of holding uses: hair grips, cotton buds, even mini loofahs.
- ◆ Use acrylic desk organisers from Muji (2), from £8.95, to neatly arrange everyday skincare creams and make-up into different compartments, ensuring you can see the labels at a glance. As a bonus your products will be stored away from humidity and heat, which can affect their potency over time.
- ◆ Make a feature of your make-up brushes. Fill a flower vase with coffee beans and stand the brushes inside. As well as easy access, it's better for the bristles than storing in a make-up bag which causes wear and tear.
- ◆ Give your empty perfume bottle new life by removing the spray top and turning it into a vase. Some twist off easily but pliers may be needed if the top is glued on. Alternatively, opt for a unisex cologne with a simple screw top.
- ◆ Have an impressive collection of miniature bottles of shampoo and conditioner? Store them in a glass pharmacy jar for a vintage apothecary feel (3).

SIMPLE WAYS TO BOOST YOUR BATHROOM INDULGENCE

- ◆ Scented candles should refresh, soothe and smell clean. The Cire Trudon Josephine candle (1), £70, opens with splashy citrus scents, followed by musks and florals.
- ◆ A reed diffuser such as Jo Malone's Pomegranate Noir Scent Surround Diffuser (2), £54, is perfect for a smaller space.
- ◆ Decanted into a glass, bath salts such as the Ila Bath Salts for Inner Peace (3), £49, will also work as room fresheners.
- ◆ A hefty glass jar of exfoliator such as Bottega Veneta Softening Body Scrub (4), £45, lifts your bathroom decor as much as it does your dull skin. Massage onto dry skin before a bath to remove dead cells, letting you better absorb the oils in your soak.
- ◆ We psychologically associate oil bottles with the type of relaxation they afford. Ginger invigorates while floral scents such as the lavender in This Works Deep Sleep Bath Oil (5), £80, help you relax. Add a capful of milk (yes, the stuff you put on your cereal) to help the oil disperse through the water.
- ◆ Perk up your bath and body oils by placing a sprig of herbs (or a piece of seaweed, as per Susanne Kauffman's Oil Bath for the Senses, £60, inside the bottle.
